In this series, in 2010, the revenue received from this route was 928 billion US dollars, while in 2011, it registered a new record and this number increased to 1030 billion dollars. Therefore, it can be said that tourism is the main part of the global economy. It has the potential to create economic growth at the international level, thus it plays a fundamental role in reducing the level of poverty in the developing countries. The development of tourism leads to an increase in the income of the people and helps to increase the production of national income and creates direct and indirect engagements and leads to an increase in the government's income (Shafi, 1393, P:78).

According to the International Council of Tourism, in which 185 countries from 25 regions were investigated, In this series, in 2018, the share of tourism was 10.4 percent, which I had in the gross domestic product of the world. The tool has been created and it is estimated that in the year 2020, the number of international travelers will increase to 1.6 billion people and their income will increase to two thousand billion dollars. 2 .Increasing the level of engagement :One of the obvious characteristics of tourism is its impact on engagement, which plays an important role in creating job opportunities and engages most people in simple tasks that do not require any expertise, in some parts of the world .In developing countries, more than 50 percent of active people are engaged in activities that are directly and indirectly related to tourism, but in some countries where the development of tourism is unrestricted, that is why tourism People engaged in related activities make up 5 percent of the population)Bakhtiari, 1389, P:54 .(Despite the fact that the primary purpose of tourism development is not to create engagement, but its development creates such a system, which has a high degree of engagement and ability, currently tourism is a source of engagement.

It is a big industry for production and it can make a fundamental change in the employment situation of the developing countries. In 1992, one out of every 15 working people was engaged in tourism, and in the same year, the total number of working people in this sector reached 130 million people, which is 6.6 percent of the working people of all sectors. This number was around 10-10 percent from 150 million people in 2005 and increased to 11 percent in 2008.) World Tourism Organization, 2009 (based on research. According to the report of the International Organization of Tourism, the tourism industry in 2012 is about 100.3 million directly .have created jobs .One out of every 12 jobs in the world is related to tourism .Based on this, the growth of the tourism industry is estimated at 4 percent until 2022, which can create 328 million jobs .Based on this, the tourism industry contributed \$6.3 trillion to GDP in 2011, creating 255 million jobs and \$743 billion in direct and indirect investment (Tourism and International Travel Council, 2012).

3.Lower unemployment rate: The tourism industry has the best effect on the lower unemployment rate, increasing the income level, providing energy resources and the handicraft market, currently in the literature of the economic development of a country.

The important issues are employment and unemployment, because employment and employment are an important source of income for people and an important reason for the eradication of poverty in society. The increase in unemployment is an important reason for the decline in economic growth and the emergence of social and political conflicts.

Therefore, tourism is an industry that employs people with different skills and ages and is an important way to overcome unemployment. (On this basis, Ghulam Sarizdi and his friends believe that tourism creates a fair distribution of income in rural areas, which itself prevents immigration to the big cities and helps the development and attractiveness of villages (Sardizi, 2012, P:17).

Also, tourism is an important factor in stimulating the growth of society's production and creating job opportunities for young people, which prevents the immigration of young people, leads to the protection of productive capacity in the region, eliminates poverty and economic development. It is considered the best way to solve the problems.) Qadiri et al., 1389, P:107), tourism can stop the evacuation of the shelters in rural areas and reduce the level of immigration of the rural community.
